YOUR LEGACY GIFT

By pledging a gift in your Will, you can give gifted girls a life-changing opportunity. No matter how big or small, your legacy gift will make a difference.

The Girls' Day School Trust is committed to improving social mobility and to helping every girl, whatever her background, fulfil her potential and her dreams.

Last year, nearly 1,100 pupils benefited from a means-tested GDST bursary, representing one in eight of the students in our fee-paying schools, of which 40% receive a full bursary.

In addition to bursaries, your legacy gift can be used to support an area of education that you feel passionate about, either at a particular GDST school or within the family of schools more generally.

If you are considering leaving a gift in your Will and would like to talk this through, do contact us at the GDST or the school you might like to support.

We could talk through the options for giving. If you would like to do so, we can arrange a visit to a GDST school.

You can leave a residuary (share of estate), pecuniary (set sum), or a particular item (stocks and shares or items of value).

You only need to include in your Will our charity name (Girls' Day School Trust), registered charity number (306983) and mention if you would like your gift to benefit a particular area, such as bursaries, or a certain school.

We always recommend that you seek the advice of a solicitor before drafting a new Will or changing an existing Will.

If you let us know about your intentions, we will acknowledge your legacy gift through our stewardship programme, which includes invitations to social events such as our Annual Reception.
